Local Project Presentation (Brenner)	PharmFIT: Expanding Access to Colorectal Cancer Screening Through Community Pharmacies, Dr. Alison Brenner, UNC PI  Alison presented on the PharmFit project; presentation available here  -Question/Comments:  [Escoffery]: Are they offering FITS in pharmacies currently?  [Brenner]: We haven't gotten to that point yet. In the small amount of data that we've already collected, we have not found many that are doing anything like this yet. We're very interested to see how people are going to conceptualize this.  [Rohweder]: When we do our national survey, we'll be able to know the prevalence of pharmacists that are actually delivering CRC screening, but we do anticipate it being very low.  [Wheeler]: With COVID, pharmacists are having to think more carefully about linkage to care after testing. 	But we have added a section to our patient survey, and added qualifiers to the questions in the patient survey, to get a sense of pharmacy utilization. How did people usd pharmacies before COVID, and how that has changed? Another thing is thinking about the timing of delivery of the both the patient and pharmacist surveys. When is it going to be appropriate to collect this information? They'll be very busy and distracted in the coming months delivering vaccinations.
